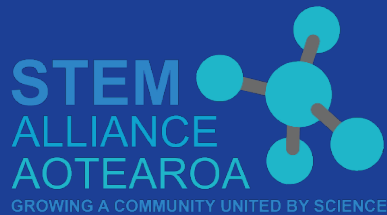

Types of external funding available

A non-exhaustive list:

- Capital
- Research-based
- Community/council grants
- Purpose-driven grants (e.g. environmental)
- Corporate sponsorships
- Competitions
- Community fundraising

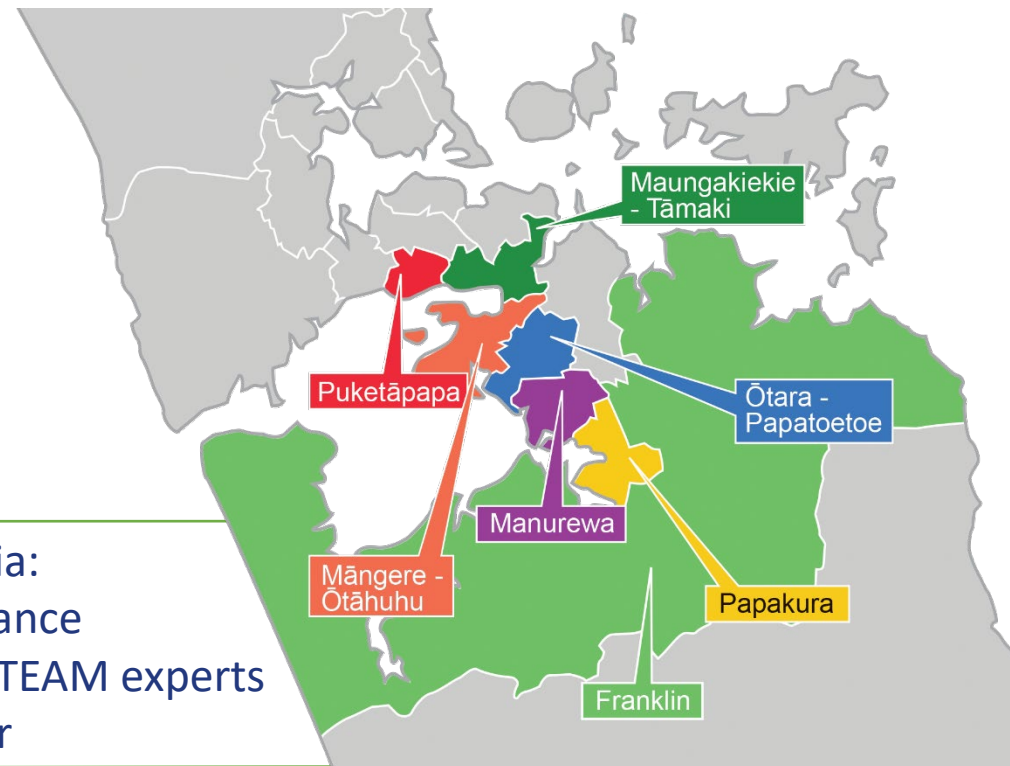

Outreach / STEM Programmes	Unlocking Curious Minds Toloa Contestable Fund	\$150,000 \$100,000	Must be regional/national in scope Priority for Pasifika communities
STEM research	Curious Minds Participatory Science Platform Teaching and Learning Research Initiative Marsden Fund	\$20,000 \$450,000 \$1 million per year	South Auckland, Taranaki and Otago only For educator-researcher partnerships

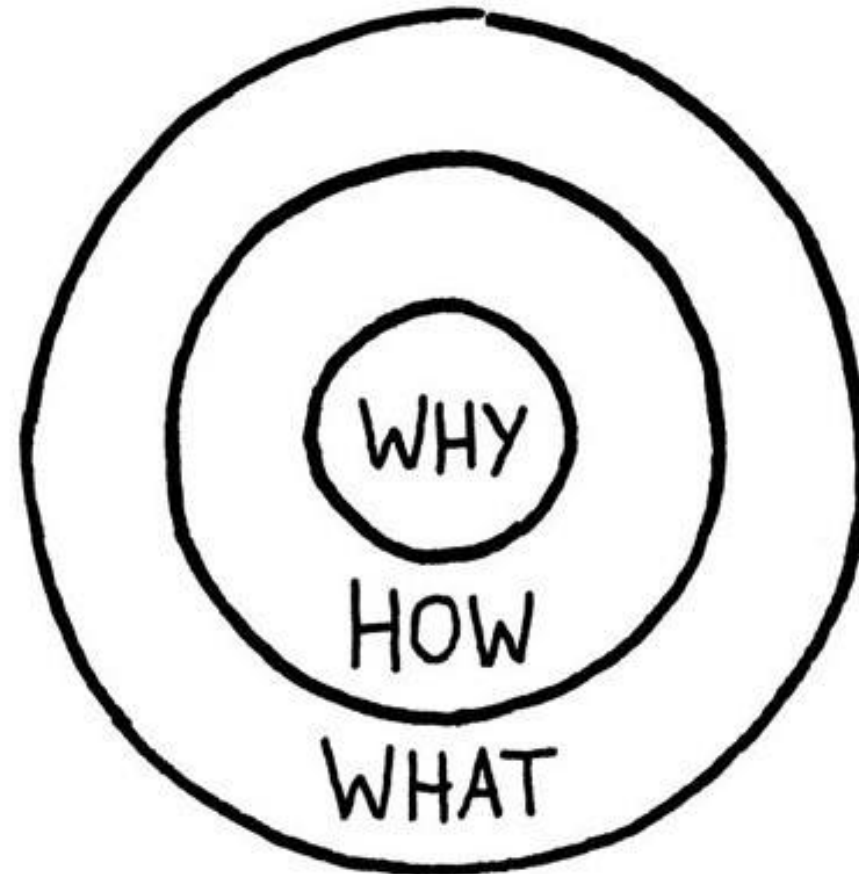
- **Community** relevance

First steps to finding funding

- Have an idea (more on this soon)
- Seek senior leadership support
- Understand your constraints
- Build a team



Prepare a pitch



Identifying the right funding for you

Breaking down what, why, how will help you see what funding you need and where you could get it from

Also consider other options e.g.

- Multiple sources
- In-kind support/donations
- Staged approach (pilot)
- Using what you have to start with
- User-pays



Top tips for preparing an application

- Check eligibility
- Read the assessment criteria and fund background
- Check what you need to apply
 - Fund requirements
 - School requirements/approvals etc
- Check timeframes and allow plenty of time!



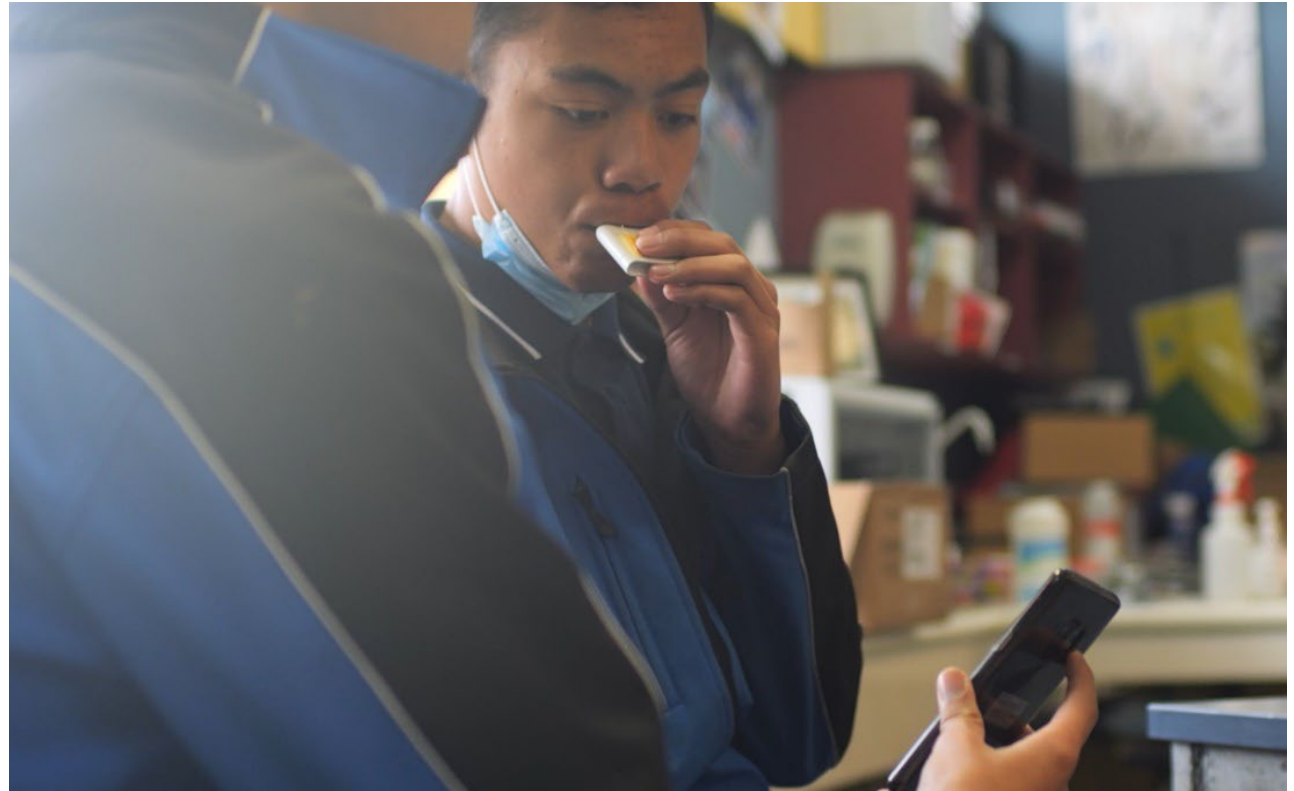
Programme planning

- Start with objectives
- Outcomes-driven
- Define a structure
- Realistic timeframes
- Be prepared to change



Programme budgeting

- Refer back to plan and milestones
- Round up, if possible
- Be pragmatic



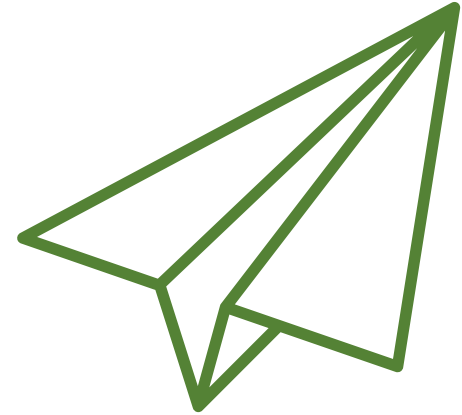
Programme budgeting - more tips!

- Be resourceful
- Think long term
- Value for money
- Sense check



Before you hit send

- Don't waffle
- Have someone proof-read
- Get senior leadership approval
- Seek feedback from funder, if possible

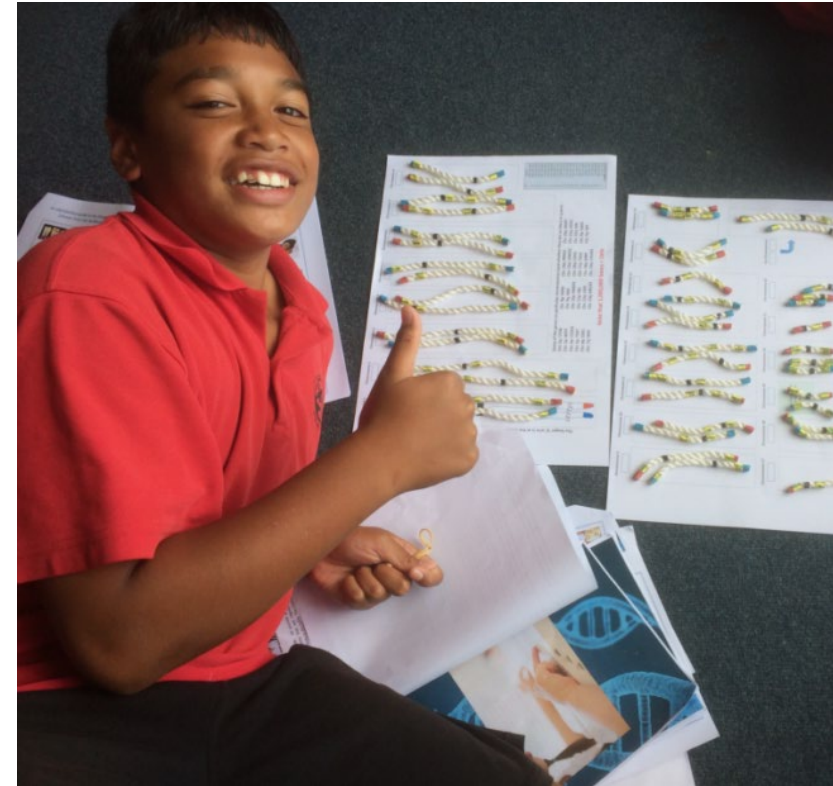

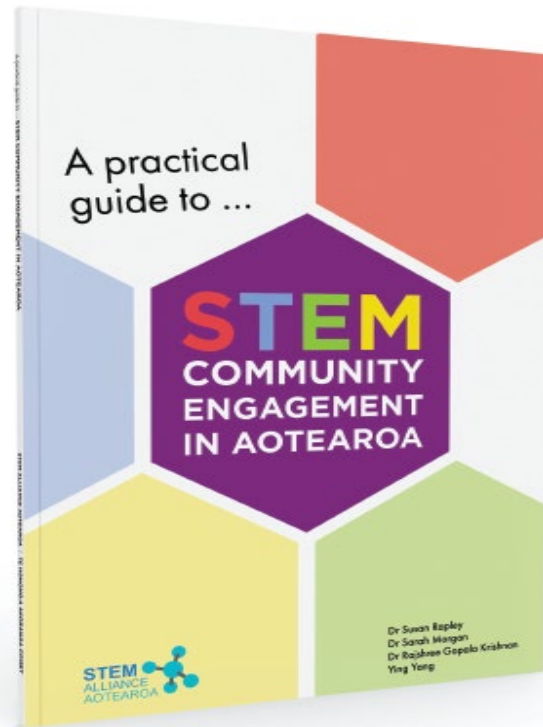


Working with external partners or funders

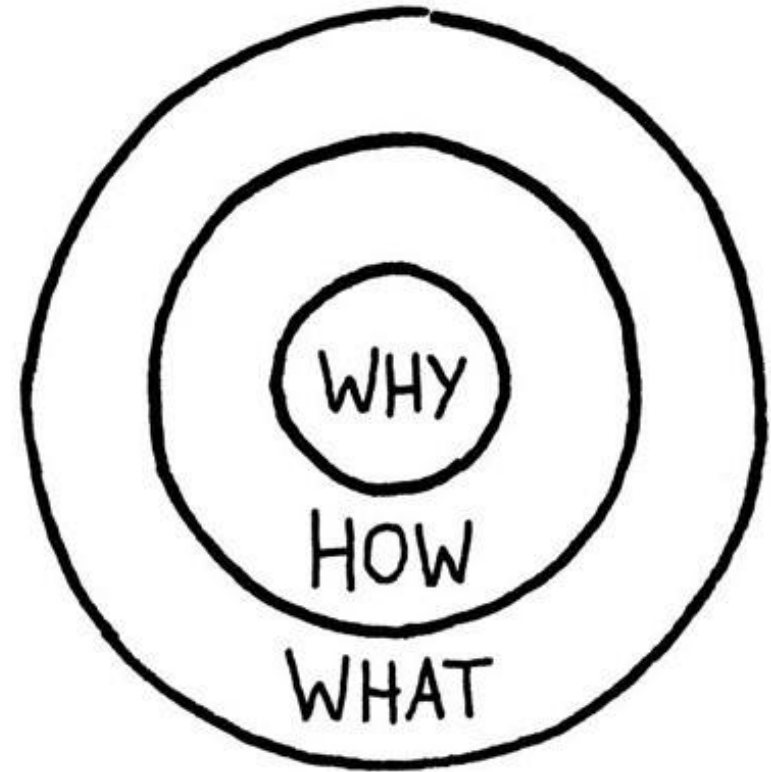
